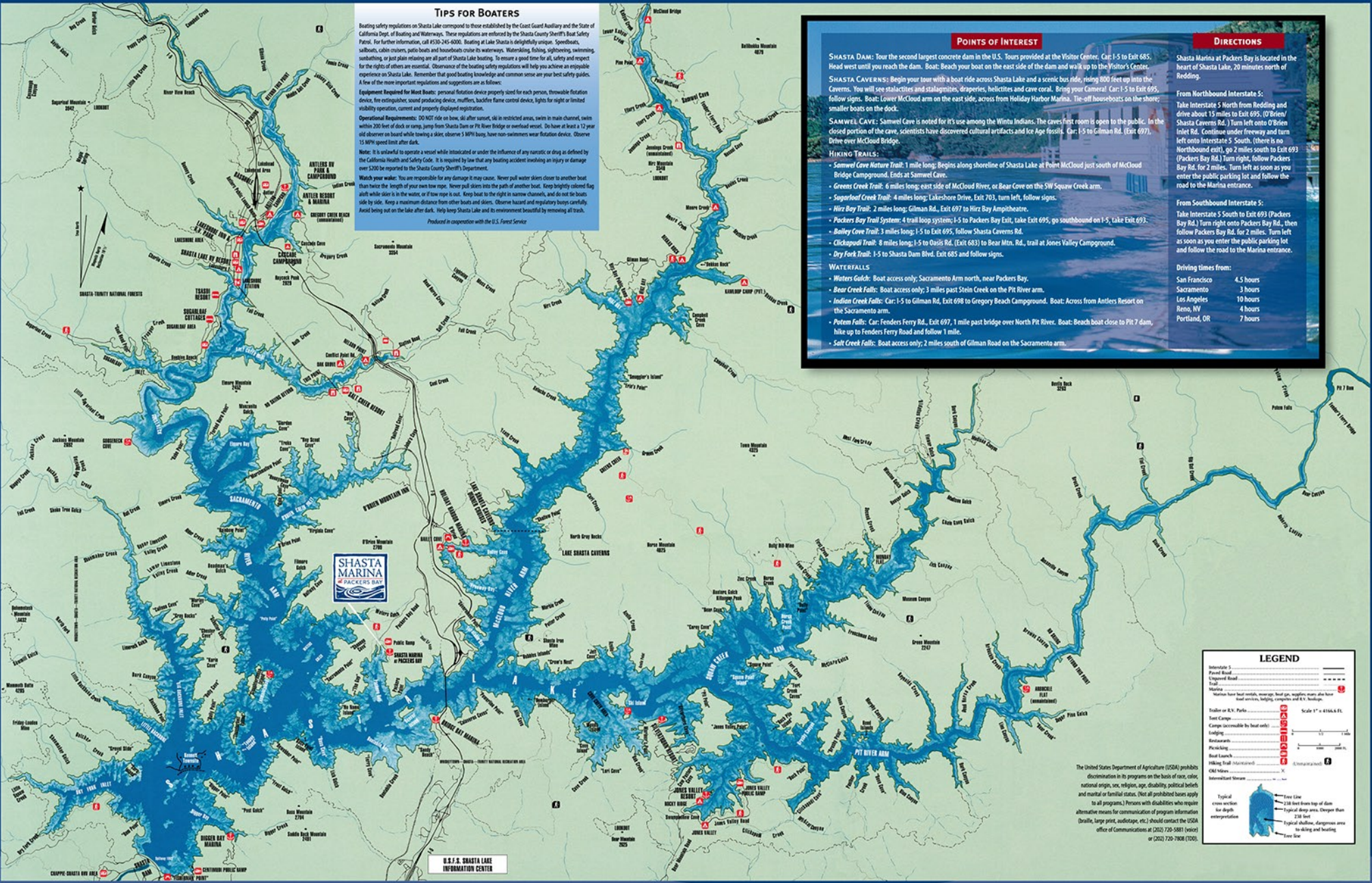


SHASTA MARINA AT PACKERS BAY + Shasta Lake Map

TIPS FOR BOATERS

Boating safety regulations on Shasta Lake correspond to those established by the Coast Guard Auxiliary and the State of California Dept. of Boating and Waterways. These regulations are enforced by the Shasta County Sheriff's Boat Safety Patrol. For further information, call (530) 245-6000. Boating at Lake Shasta is delightfully unique. Speedboats, sailboats, cabin cruisers, patio boats and houseboats cruise the waterways. Water skiing, fishing, sightseeing, swimming, sunbathing, or just plain relaxing are all part of Shasta Lake boating. To ensure a good time for all, safety and respect for the rights of others are essential. Clearance of the boating safety regulations will help you achieve an enjoyable experience on Shasta Lake. Remember that good boating knowledge and common sense are your best safety guides. A few of the more important regulations and suggestions are as follows:

Equipment Required for Most Boats: personal flotation device properly sized for each person, throwable flotation device, fire extinguisher, sound producing device, mufflers, hooded flame control device, lights for night or limited visibility operation, current and properly displayed registration.

Operational Requirements: DO NOT ride on bow, ski in restricted areas, swim in main channel, swim within 200 feet of dock or ramp, jump from Shasta Dam or Pit River Bridge or overland vessel. Do have at least a 12 year old observer on board while towing a skier, observer 5 MPH buoy, have non-swimmers wear flotation device. Observe 15 MPH speed limit at dark.

Note: It is unlawful to operate a vessel while intoxicated or under the influence of any narcotic or drug as defined by the California Health and Safety Code. It is required by law that any boating accident involving an injury or damage over \$200 be reported to the Shasta County Sheriff's Department.

Watch your water: You are responsible for any damage it may cause. Never pull water skiers closer to another boat than twice the length of your own tow rope. Never pull skiers into the path of another boat. Keep brightly colored flag aloft while skier is in the water, or if tow rope is out. Keep boat to the right in narrow channels, and do not tie boats side by side. Keep a maximum distance from other boats and skiers. Observe hazard and regulatory buoys carefully. Avoid being out on the lake after dark. Help keep Shasta Lake and its environment beautiful by removing all trash.

POINTS OF INTEREST

SHASTA DAM: Tour the second largest concrete dam in the U.S. Tours provided at the Visitor Center. Car: I-5 to Exit 685. Head west until you reach the dam. Boat: Beach your boat on the east side of the dam and walk up to the Visitor's Center.

SHASTA CAVERNS: Begin your tour with a boat ride across Shasta Lake and a scenic bus ride, flying 800 feet up into the Caverns. You will see stalactites and stalagmites, draperies, helictites and cave coral. Bring your Camera! Car: I-5 to Exit 695, follow signs. Boat: Lower McCloud arm on the east side, across from Holiday Harbor Marina. Tie-off houseboats on the shore; smaller boats on the dock.

SAMUEL CAVE: Samuel Cave is noted for it's use among the Wintu Indians. The caves' first room is open to the public. In the closed portion of the cave, scientists have discovered cultural artifacts and Ice Age fossils. Car: I-5 to Gilman Rd. (Exit 697). Drive over McCloud Bridge.

HIKING TRAILS:

- **Samuel Cave Nature Trail:** 1 mile long; Begins along shoreline of Shasta Lake at Point McCloud just south of McCloud Bridge Campground. Ends at Samuel Cave.
- **Greens Creek Trail:** 6 miles long; east side of McCloud River, or Bear Cove on the SW Square Creek arm.
- **Sugarloaf Creek Trail:** 4 miles long; Lakeshore Drive, Exit 703, turn left, follow signs.
- **Hirz Bay Trail:** 2 miles long; Gilman Rd., Exit 697 to Hirz Bay Amphitheatre.
- **Packers Bay Trail System:** 4 trail loop systems; I-5 to Packers Bay Exit, take Exit 695, go southbound on I-5, Lake Exit 697.
- **Bearley Creek Trail:** 3 miles long; I-5 to Exit 695, follow Shasta Caverns Rd.
- **Chickadee Trail:** 8 miles long; I-5 to Oatis Rd. (Exit 683) to Bear Altar Rd., trail at Jones Valley Campground.
- **Dry Fork Trail:** I-5 to Shasta Dam Blvd. Exit 685 and follow signs.

WATERFALLS:

- **Waters Gulch:** Boat access only; Sacramento Arm north, near Packers Bay.
- **Bear Creek Falls:** Boat access only; 3 miles past Stein Creek on the Pit River arm.
- **Indian Creek Falls:** Car: I-5 to Gilman Rd, Exit 698 to Gregory Beach Campground. Boat: Across from Antlers Resort on the Sacramento arm.
- **Potem Falls:** Car: Fenders Ferry Rd., Exit 697, 1 mile past bridge over North Pit River. Boat: Beach boat close to Pit 7 dam, hike up to Fenders Ferry Road and follow 1 mile.
- **Salt Creek Falls:** Boat access only; 2 miles south of Gilman Road on the Sacramento arm.

DIRECTIONS

Shasta Marina at Packers Bay is located in the heart of Shasta Lake, 20 minutes north of Redding.

From Northbound Interstate 5: Take Interstate 5 North from Redding and drive about 15 miles to Exit 695. (O'Brien/ Shasta Caverns Rd.) Turn left onto O'Brien Inlet Rd. Continue under freeway and turn left onto Interstate 5 South. (There is no Northbound exit), go 2 miles south to Exit 693 (Packers Bay Rd.) Turn right, follow Packers Bay Rd. for 2 miles. Turn left as soon as you enter the public parking lot and follow the road to the Marina entrance.

From Southbound Interstate 5: Take Interstate 5 South to Exit 693 (Packers Bay Rd.) Turn right onto Packers Bay Rd., then follow Packers Bay Rd. for 2 miles. Turn left as soon as you enter the public parking lot and follow the road to the Marina entrance.
